

'22 in Review

2022 - What a year!. We started with a bang in May and continued to the end of November with Exhibits, Events and several pop-up specials. The combined support of the Board of Directors, Volunteers, Donors and Leelanau Township Community Foundation, Rotary Club of Traverse City, Northwest Michigan Arts & Culture Network, Michigan Arts & Culture Council and National Endowment for the Arts helped create an amazing and memorable year.

Each of our events celebrate the time, talent and works of our many artists and community members. We hold deep gratitude for the support provided by many organizations and people, allowing NAA to offer the following venues.

Our highlights from the year include:

MAY

Two events shared the stage in early May. The opening of Northport Art Association's (NAA) Clay Studio and a floor to ceiling exhibit celebrating the works of our Figure Drawing Studio artists.

Figure Drawing Studio Quick Draw Exhibit

Our Figure Drawing Studio shared floor to ceiling works of 674 unique drawings of volunteer models. Each piece was completed in 20 minutes or less during our Monday night sessions. Since 2019, Chris Woomer facilitates these free 6:30 - 8:30 sessions nurturing all levels of ability. Our many artists enjoy spending creative time in these structured, yet informal sessions.

Guests shared their amazement of the artistry and work created by sixteen artists in these timed drawings. We

appreciate the involvement of many artists who have attended and our volunteer models who pose every week!

Clay Studio Grand Opening

Coinciding with the fabulous Quick-draw Exhibit, three other milestones occurred in our art community. The new Clay Studio opened its doors to members, instructors and guest artists. Our Leelanau Township Community Foundation Offices received a beautiful remodel. Financial Picture

While the Northport Arts Association (NAA) is currently in the black, after a major capital expansion, we are reporting negative net income of \$5,607.97 for fiscal year 2022.

2022 saw construction of the new Clay Studio with build-out costs and capital purchases totaling \$71,120.99. These funds were primarily raised in 2021 via grants and fundraising donations. Additionally, Clay Studio pays monthly rent to the Leelanau Township Community Foundation (\$7,650 in 2022 as we took possession in April 2022, \$10,800 expected in 2023).

In 2022, NAA paid \$26,036.9 directly to local artists and instructors through the various programs, exhibits, awards, classes and events offered.

In 2022, Leelanau Uncaged Arts Festival moved their committee to the Village of Northport. All funds previously raised by that committee were passed to the Leelanau Township Community Foundation (a 501c3) into the "Future by Design Fund" for disbursement to the 2022 Uncaged Arts Festival.

Our current estimated operating budget for 2023 is \$96,000, which leads us to be approximately \$25k short of current net revenue.

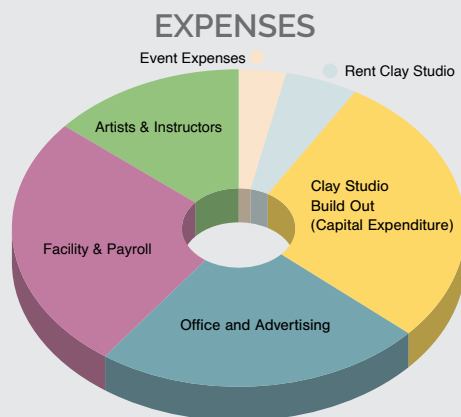
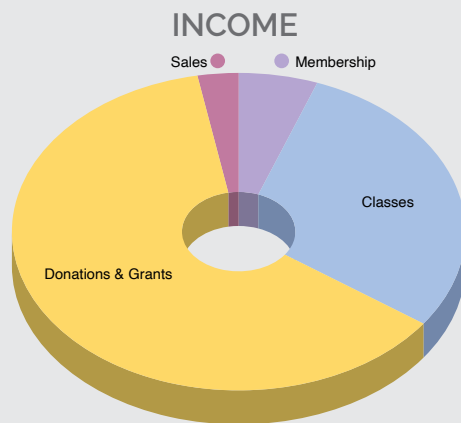
Over the next year our concentration is on large donor funding and major grants to build needed reserve funds and support future initiatives. NAA's board attends classes and seminars on fundraising and grant proposals.

To maintain our 501c3 status we must receive our operational funding through community support (not commerce).

As we gain financial momentum, our next goal is to identify and hire an Executive Director in the 3rd quarter of 2023. The Executive Director's job description focuses on managing the upcoming expanded programs, events and raising sustaining funds.

Ultimately, with support from our community, our objective of making Northport a destination for the arts will be cemented for years to come.

Throughout 2022, expenses continued to be managed tightly with volunteers handling provisioning, catering, gardening, facility upgrades and maintenance. Board members created our graphic design, copy writing, advertising and promotions in house. Accounting, bookkeeping and management tasks were also performed by volunteers.
