We invite you to explore our achievements and initiatives furthering our mission in cultivating a thriving arts culture here in Northport Michigan.

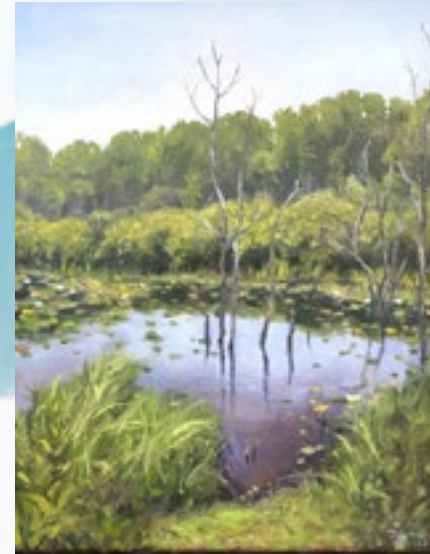

NAA provided local artists with invaluable opportunities to showcase their talents and connect with audiences. With that in mind we are looking to create and promote a "NoMI Young Art Collectors Group" (Northern Michigan Young Art Collectors Group) with programs that bring the next generation of Artists and collectors together.

In The Clay Studio, the search for funds for the electrical and build-out for the installation of our large-capacity kiln (generously donated by The Michael Chetcuti Foundation in 2022) is a top priority. This addition expands our capacity for ceramics and is vital in attracting artist-in-residence talent and experience to our facility.

As we move forward, we remain dedicated to our mission. Fostering creativity, nurturing talent and cultivating a vibrant arts scene enriches the lives of all who call our beautiful peninsula HOME.

Without the time and effort from our volunteers Northport Arts Association could not exist.

Volunteering at NAA is an experience filled with opportunities for personal growth, community engagement and meaningful connections. MAY- JUNE

May 10-21 Arts of Our Members Annual Exhibit and Open House. Leelanau Township Community Foundation along with the Northport Performing Arts Center and Northport Arts Association joined together for a second annual Community Open House. People celebrated while enjoying art, refreshments and the smooth Jazz sounds from Northport's North Coast Trio with Amanda Kruk. NAA members displayed and sold a wide variety of art, crafts and pottery.

May 26-June 11 Northport Photo Exhibit, Photographers showcased a variety of genres, including landscapes, waterscapes, wildlife and architecture.

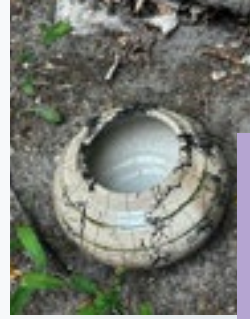
In recognition of the longstanding Cars in the Park car show held over Memorial Day weekend, a new award category for automotive photography was introduced. One of the highlights of this

and laughs. During each session, interesting art is produced using a variety of media; digital, oil, charcoal, pastel, pencil, pen and ink.

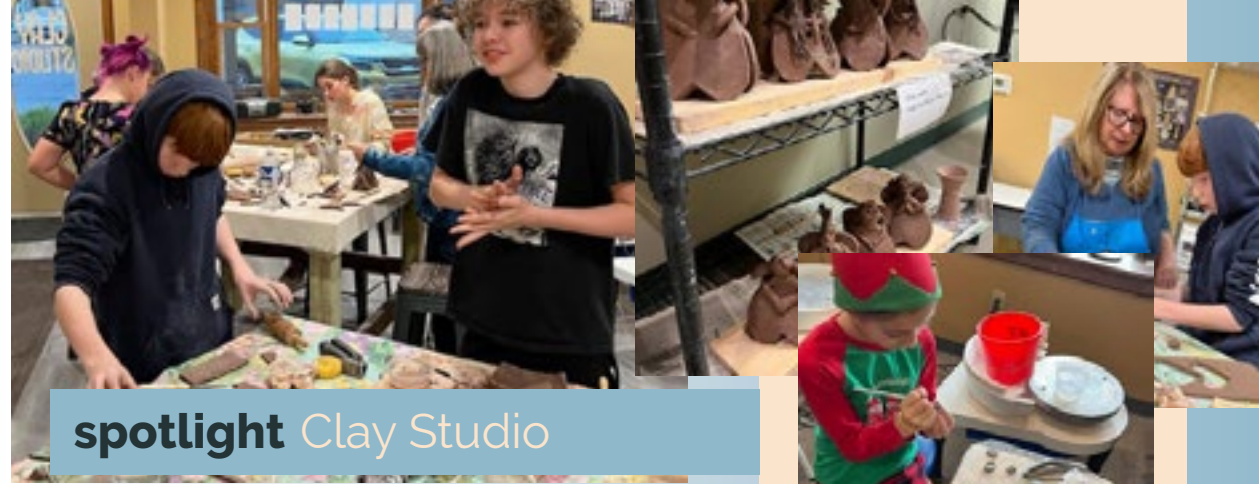

Northport Clay Studio is a community-oriented pottery venue offering opportunities for individuals to engage in wheel throwing, hand building and sculpture. Established in 2022 with the support of the community, the studio operates year-round and welcomes members of all ages.

Our facilities include 5 electric pottery wheels, two Skutt electric kilns, a Robert Brent Slab roller, as well as low fire white ware and high fire stoneware clay, along with a diverse selection of glazes tailored to different clay bodies.

The studio maintains regular hours, open daily to members and hosts weekly classes.

Looking ahead, one of our goals is to enhance our capabilities by funding the installation of the high-capacity commercial kiln (Generously donated by The Michael Chetcuti Foundation) to

accommodate oversized pieces, thereby attracting artists in residence who further contribute to our creative community. Building upon our initial success, we aspire to broaden our class offerings, particularly targeting families and senior citizens with limited incomes.

Currently, our financial situation is at a break-even point (refer to Financial page 15). However, to fulfill our expansion plans, including the installation of the large kiln and necessary electric upgrades, we rely on the generosity of donors, regardless of the size of their contributions. Your support enables us to extend tuition subsidies and further our mission of making ceramic arts accessible to all.

Financial Picture

Northport Arts Association is in a solid financial position in 2023, with donations and program income outpacing expenses. That year, NAA disbursed \$40,823.89 directly to local artists and instructors across various programs, exhibits, awards, classes and events—an increase from \$26,036.90 in 2022.

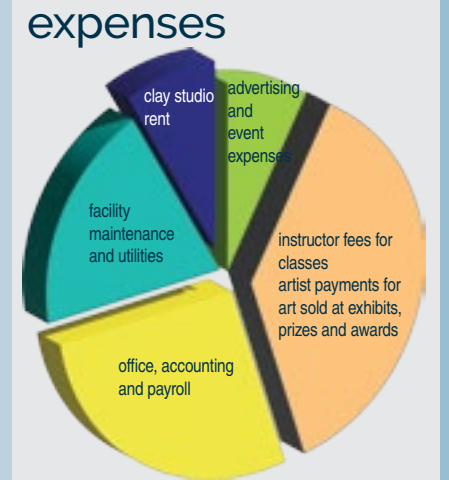
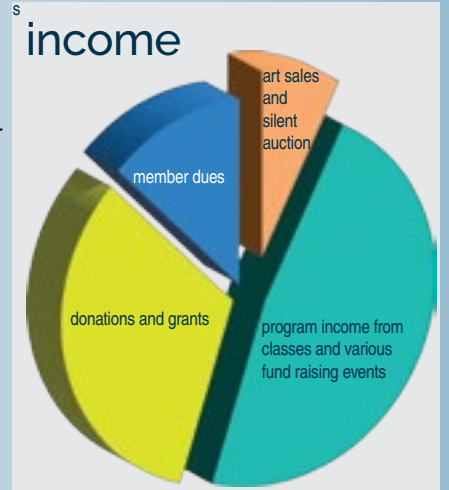
The estimated operating budget for 2023 was \$96,000, which was successfully raised. All expenditures remained under budget, largely due to significant volunteer efforts and the active involvement of the board of directors.

Looking ahead, our focus for the next year is on securing large donor funding and major grants to build necessary reserve funds and

support future initiatives. To maintain our 501c3 status, it's imperative that the bulk of our operational funding comes from community support versus commercial activities.

Last year, we also shared our next major goal: to recruit an Executive Director tasked with managing upcoming expanded programs, events and fundraising efforts. We're pleased to announce that the committee is in the final stages of the selection process and the start date for this role is April 1, 2024.

With continued support from our community, we are transforming Northport into an arts destination, while ensuring that Northport Arts Association remains an affordable haven for artists to thrive and create.



Clay Studio is a separate entity within the Northport Arts Association (501c3)

Income is received from donations, grants, 30% class fee, studio memberships and 30% pottery exhibit sales.

Annually Expenses Average:

\$11,400 Rent paid to the Leelanau Township Community Foundation

\$1600 Electricity

\$4500 Clay and Glaze Supplies

\$300. Misc tools, cleaning supplies and consumables such as paper towels and garbage bags

\$350 Insurance

70% paid to instructors fees per class

70% paid to artists for exhibit sales

Trips downstate for supplies, kiln firing, clean up, clay recycling, scheduling, management, repairs, bookkeeping and instruction are currently being done by board volunteers (saving thousands).



We average approximately 4,000 annual hours of volunteer time across various areas, including Website, Graphic Design & Promotions, Building Maintenance, Landscaping, Kids Camp, Teaching, Bookkeeping, Event Catering, Copy writing, Facility Upkeep, Clay Studio Management, Board and Committee Meetings, Figure Drawing Studio, Grant Writing and more. Additionally, the generosity of Bill and Nina Collins, who donated the Village Arts Building to the NAA in 2016, has a yearly value of \$30,000 in rent savings, totaling an estimated value of well over \$200,000 in annual savings and support.

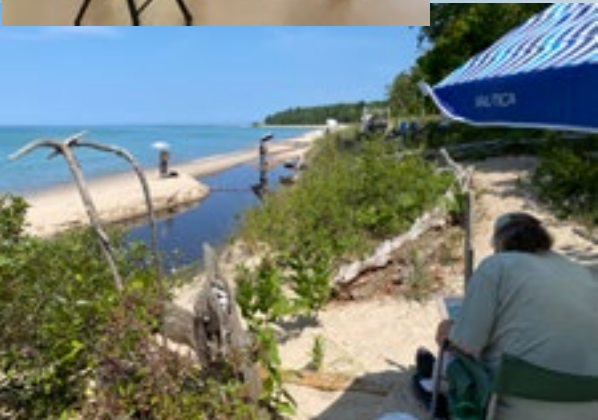
