President's Message

A Year of Challenges and a Year of Celebrations!

I remember writing a letter last year that expressed my optimism that we would all weather the pandemic and by this time of the next year we would be fully open and rejoicing in returning to our former lives. If anything, the pandemic has taught me to accept the challenges, stay flexible with "plan B", and celebrate the many successes that come our way.

Looking back, our Northport Arts Association has so much to be thankful for. It has been a year of amazing and successful grant writing by so many dedicated individuals. We have received a grant from Traverse City Rotary Charities that started us off with funds for the Northport Clay Studio. The Assets for Thriving Communities Grant allowed us to secure the space from the Leelanau Township Foundation, reserve our spot for renovation with 2xT Construction and get our fundraising campaign off to a great start.

We have received two grants from the Michigan Council of Arts and Cultural Affairs (MCACA) that have given us money to promote our exhibits and secure our Art Administrator for part-time year round employment. These two grants came at a much-needed time since COVID took away so many of our classes and exhibits for revenue to support our operational income.

A new website was rolled out last March by a creative team of graphic artists. Linda Bayer, Sheen Watkins and Lydia Woodruff spent hours re-working a new website that is more accessible and enjoyable to use.

Although the pandemic slowed us down we never stopped offering evening Figure Drawing each Monday night from 6:30 to 8:30 with live clothed models. Chris Woomer and

her dedicated group will be showing their progress in a beautiful exhibit this May.

We had so much to be thankful for in 2021, but we came together to morn the loss of two of our beloved artists. Gene and Judy Rantz will always be remembered for their creative spirit and many contributions to our art organization. We are in the process of creating a memorial bench in their honor to adorn our entrance along with creating a scholarship for children to enjoy the love of art. We are still accepting donations towards these memorials if anyone wishes to contribute. Our annual Plein Air Paint Out will now be called the Gene Rantz Plein Air Paint Out to honor Gene's enthusiasm and effort for each Plein Air Show. in bringing plein air artists to Northport since 2013. 2022 year marks ten years of plein air for the Northport Arts Association Looking ahead, we are working on a Five Year Strategic Plan, which is evolving with your help as we move into 2022. We plan to open the Northport Clay Studio in April with memberships and classes available first to our members. We are planning on many exhibits and classroom art instruction so stay tuned to the NAA Weekly and emails for sign up

I wish to close with a special "Thank You" to all of you for your generous donations and making our art center a place to foster and promote artistic expression throughout the community.

Finance Report

NIAA carvac a broad artistic community by creating

The NAA is pleased to report a balanced budget in 2021 and report a positive net revenue of \$59,929. This was made possible by grants we received from Traverse City Rotary and Michigan Council of Arts and Cultural Affairs, in addition to the generous support of our members and donors. The support receive from donations, gifts-in-kind and many hours of committee volunteer work, allows the NAA to continue to provide a haven for our talented community of artists to learn, instruct, exhibit and grow.


In 2021, with the pandemic continuing to affect functions, the NAA was still able to pay \$25,214 directly to artists and instructors through the various programs, exhibits, classes and events offered.

There are many plans for the upcoming year and the enthusiasm and donation support from our community creates the funding and energy that inspires the Board of Directors and other committee volunteers to continue their work to make it happen.

One of the goals for 2022 was to find a new Treasurer and Secretary to serve on the Board. That was achieved at the last full member meeting in December where Linda Gits was voted in as Treasurer and Lisa Westling was elected as Secretary.

Another mile marker goal of funding the construction of the new Clay Studio was also achieved. Construction is almost finished and the Clay Studio is on schedule to be open this spring.

Our current estimated operating budget for 2022 is \$85,150 approximately \$25k short of current net revenue. Over the next year we are focusing on building some needed reserve funds to rebuild the momentum that was lost during the 2020-2021 pandemic and continue to work towards hiring an Executive Director.


2021 in Review





Northport's Plein Air Paint Out

The Northport Arts Association celebrated the ninth Plein Air Event with a Wet Paint Sale reception on July 23 and 24.

Fifty artists signed up to paint throughout the tip of Leelanau Peninsula and the Village of Northport. The artists did a spectacular job capturing the beauty of the area... even in the downpour of rain we had on Saturday. Overall, 98 original paintings were created and displayed.

We made a few changes in 2021 and had two Wet Paint Sales. Friday the artists completed their paintings by 4pm, the show was hung by 5pm and judging was complete by 6pm. Then the doors opened to guests waiting to see the show. There was a flurry of excitement and paintings were selling. A comment we heard: "We found a painting we wanted, turned around for 30 seconds and it was gone. It's okay; we found another one and didn't hesitate" We did the same process on Saturday again with wonderful attendance and art sales.
